To have Class D license already to purchase a Class D-2. Poker machines have to be separate area from rest of store. Can limit to poker area only and roped off? Billie Simmons suggested make it where D-2 license not eligible for outdoor events.

At this time there are five businesses with poker machines per Alderman Ford.
