Water – Mayor Littlefield: Nothing to report. EPA called and city to meet with Jamie Cowles, he said need to run water department like a business because of the expenses of wells, chemicals and the actual water. Storage tank needs to be painted. Inspection went well per Mayor Littlefield.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Discuss/Approve payments for Jerry Ford's water bill Has large water bill, \$397.58 would like an extra month or so to pay the bill. He is not working at this time. Water softener got stuck open according to Mr. Ford. Motion by Alderman Miller with a second by Alderman Kelley to allow Jerry Ford to pay an extra \$100.00 each month plus regular bill till paid in full, roll call vote, motion carried all ayes.
- 2. Discuss/Approve payments for Connie Lannery's water bill. Ms. Lannery also has a large water bill of \$233.96 because of hot water heater problems. Ms. Lannery said she could pay \$50.00 plus regular bill each month. Motion by Alderman Spotloe, second by Alderman Clark, to approve Connie Lannery to an extra \$50.00 each month along with her regular water bill till paid off, roll call vote, and motion carried all ayes.
- 3. Discuss/Approve Jason Herrick's water bill. Jason Herrick had a water break on his side of meter \$1,029.27. It went thru the meter. Mayor Littlefield asked Mr. Herrick what he was looking for regarding his bill. He states it is a rather large bill for one month. It was in the building next to 2 Cousins, dirt floor no drain. Jason said there was a hole in sewer pipe. The Mayor says contour floor slopes to the sewer system with a hole in it, Jason says it does not. Pipe is exposed above the ground, he is going to fill in. He wants to only pay \$500.00 and city write off the rest. Alderman Spotloe wants to know what sewer charge was \$358.13. Alderman need to go see basement for themselves. Mayor went to basement to look with city public works employee to check new water meter. Motion by Alderman Miller, second by Alderman Lafary, that water bill be paid in full and waive sewer \$358.13, roll call vote, motion carried all ayes. No vote by Alderman Pascal because it is her son.
