Ordinance No. 2021- 6

An Ordinance Relating to the Placement of Stop Signs within the City Limits of Lewistown, Illinois.

WHEREAS the creation of a traffic schedule and posting of stop signs at certain intersections are necessary for the protection of the safety and welfare of the citizenry;

WHEREAS Chapter 77, Schedule III(A) of the City Ordinances provides for the erection and maintenance of stop signs;

WHEREAS certain railroad crossings in the City of Lewistown were closed down and the same has alleviated the necessity for a stop sign which has previously been determined to be necessary for the protection of the safety and welfare of the citizenry; and

WHEREAS the eastbound and westbound stops at the intersection of East Eisenhower Avenue and North Elm Street have been identified as sites upon which the placement of a stop sign is no longer necessary to protect the safety and welfare of the citizenry and serves only to impede traffic;

THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEWISTOWN, FULTON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section I:

The stop signs currently placed at the southwest and northeast corners of the intersection of East Eisenhower Avenue and North Elm Street stopping eastbound and westbound traffic at such intersection shall be removed.

Section II:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten days after its publication in pamphlet form, but in no event prior to erection of signs indicating the above changes in traffic flow.
